

COVID-19 – DUBAI TRAVEL REGULATIONS

- Compliance with all precautionary measures applied in Dubai (wearing masks, maintaining 2m social distance and washing hands regularly).
- All tourists and residents arriving into Dubai from any point of origin (including GCC countries) must hold a negative PCR test certificate, for which the test must be taken no more than 72 hours prior to the time of departure.
- As announced on 19 June 2021 and effective from 23 June 2021, travelers from certain countries must hold a negative PCR test, taken no more than 48 hours prior to the time of departure. Please see the following links for a list of countries which this is now applicable for:

- Negative COVID-19 certificates must be printed in English or Arabic; PCR certificates in other languages are acceptable if they can be validated at the originating station (the date and time of the test must be detailed). The printed certificate must have a valid QR code. No handwritten, SMS or digital certificates will be accepted.
- UAE nationals are exempt from the above but will be required to take a PCR test on arrival at Dubai airport, unless the country of origin requires a pre-travel test.

- For select destinations, residents and tourists may be required to take two COVID-19 PCR tests: one before departure, and a second test upon arrival in Dubai. Please [click here](#) for a list of destinations where this is applicable.
- Effective from 23 June 2021 and as part of easing inbound travel restrictions, Dubai's Supreme Committee of Crisis and Disaster Management has introduced new entry protocols for passengers. The following requirements are necessary when travelling to Dubai:
 - Those arriving from certain countries should have received two doses of a vaccine approved by UAE authorities.
 - Residents arriving from certain countries should have received two doses of a vaccine approved by UAE authorities.
 - Those arriving from certain countries should take a rapid PCR test four hours prior to departure.
